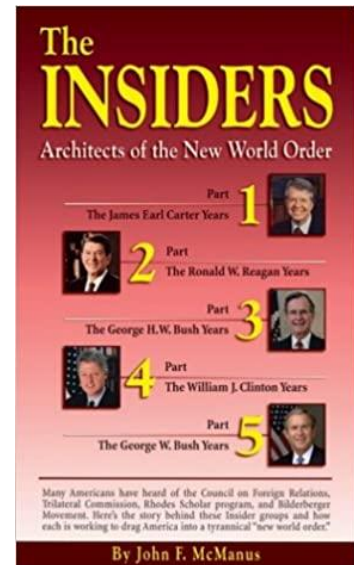


## The Insiders – Key Points
